March Program Lee dePalo, Manatee County Director of Community and Veterans Services

Lee dePalo is the Director of Community and Veterans Services (CVS) Department at Manatee County. CVS is



focused on enhancing the quality of life for its residents, with a special commitment to Veterans and their families, through a wide range of services, development projects, and community engagement initiatives. He plans to speak about what CVS does to support our veterans, but he

will also discuss FEMA's response to COVID.

Lee spent most of his career in public service but joined Manatee county after two years in the private sector where he served as the Chief Operating Officer for an emergency management startup. Prior to that, Lee was a member of the Senior Executive Service and served as the Regional Administrator for FEMA Region VIII.

Lee is a U.S. Air Force veteran whose career spanned 26 years, 14 locations, and multiple combat deployments to Afghanistan, Iraq, Haiti, Pakistan, Uzbekistan, and Turkey. He was a career special operations and combat rescue helicopter pilot with over 3800 hours primarily in MH-60G "Pave Hawk" and HH-3E "Jolly Green Giant" helicopters.

Lee graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy. He also holds a Master of Strategic Studies degree from Air War College and a Master of Arts degree in management from Webster University.

FLT volunteers carry a small flag and march in just before the ceremony begins and then stand one at a time when the names of the deceased veterans names are called. You have the best seats in the house. If you have never attended this ceremony, you should volunteer, represent MOAA, and be guaranteed a seat. We have 600-700 people attend the King's Point Veterans Theater for the ceremony. March and April luncheons will be your last chance to volunteer. Please help.

I will leave you with this short story titled **"Freedom's Cost"** from <u>In God We STILL Trust</u>, by Dr. Richard G. Lee. A wise person once said, "Freedom is never free."

Nathan Hale (1755-1776) was a schoolteacher when the Revolutionary War broke out in April 1775. After hearing about the siege of Boston in a letter from a friend, Hale joined his five brothers in the fight for independence.

Hale fought under General George Washington in New York as British General William Howe began a military buildup on Long Island. When Washington asked for a volunteer to go on a spy mission behind enemy lines, Hale stepped forward. For a week he gathered information on the position of British troops, but he was captured while returning to the American side. Because of the incriminating papers Hale possessed, the British knew he was a spy. Howe order the twenty-year-old Hale to be hanged the following day without a trial.

Patriot Nathan Hale was hanged on September 22, 1776. Before he gave his life for his country, he made a short speech, ending with these famous and inspiring words:

"I only regret that I have but one life to lose for my country."

As John Quincy Adams said, "You will never know how much it has cost my generation to preserve your freedom. I hope you will make good use of it." We must do all we can to protect the freedoms that generations past have entrusted to us.

Patriot's Prayer: Almighty God, may we as a nation be ever grateful for the men and women who have given – or are today giving – their lives to give us freedom. Amen.

Spring is the time of year where we looking forward to all the new blossoms, and it is also when we recognize our emerging leaders. The Junior Reserve Officer's Training Program (JROTC) begins its award ceremonies this March and continues through until the end of May.

The MOAA JROTC award program recognizes an outstanding cadet in his or her next-to-last year in the program who has demonstrated exceptional potential for military leadership (exceptional academic achievement in the case of the Marine Corps JROTC program). MOAA presents the chosen cadet with a medal and certificate to acknowledge their achievement. The presentation of an MOAA JROTC medal and certificate is an excellent way for our chapter to gain exposure in the community, advertise the chapter, and, at the same time, foster a positive military recognition among the youth of the community.

The award consists of a red, white, and blue ribbon with a bronze disc pendant and a matching service

ribbon. These items are in a presentation case. The cadet will also receive a certificate presented in a folder. These items will be presented during the program's awards ceremony.

To be eligible for an award, a candidate must be in the next-to-last year of a JROTC program;

- be in good academic standing;
- be of high moral character;
- demonstrate a high degree of loyalty to the unit, school, and country;
- and demonstrate exceptional potential for military leadership.



I need your help. As a chapter, we take great pride in presenting this ribbon in person. The Sun City Center Chapter covers ten schools across Hillsborough County, many of which are a distance from us. I would like to ask if we have volunteers who would be willing to travel to the ceremonies to present our award. Securities

It may be to your financial advantage to give marketable securities – stocks, bonds, or mutual funds – instead of cash as a gift to the MOAA Scholarship Fund or The MOAA Foundation.

Any securities you have owned for more than 12 months that have increased in value since you bought them are subject to long-term capital gains tax when you sell them. However, if you make a gift of these securities to The Scholarship Fund or The MOAA Foundation, you can save twice – once when you receive a charitable deduction for the securities' fair market value as of the day of transfer, and again when you avoid the taxes on capital gains. Do Business Cards Still Matter?

Think about the last time you were at an event and collected a bunch of business cards. What did you do with them when you got home? Be honest.

My guess: Cards from people who you couldn't remember ended up in the trash, and you kept a few from people you planned to contact ... maybe the ones with a note or a star on the back as a reminder.

In a networking setting, the business card is a means to an end – connection. Whether you have a paper or digital business card matters a lot less than ensuring *you have one*. Your card is both a practical tool and a personal-professional branding medium.

Building a Better Card

Do not overthink your business card. Make it as user-friendly as possible. If you've decided to go the traditional, printed route, consider the following:

Keep it simple. Your name, email, and phone number will suffice. Feel free to add your LinkedIn QR code or link, but avoid too much clutter.

Finish strong. Use a matte finish, not a shiny gloss, so either you or your contact can make a note on the card without a smudge or an inkstained finger.

Stock options. Use a white or light-colored stock card – notes made by a blue or black pen should be easily readable.

Include a rank? That's up to you. If you are targeting the defense sector, your rank can show you have experience in the industry. If you are not targeting that space, consider leaving it off. Still not sure? Consider making two sets — it won't break the bank!

3rd Short-Term Funding Extension Will Keep Government Open Until March

President Joe Biden signed legislation Jan. 19 to temporarily extend federal funding into March, averting a partial government shutdown.

The House and Senate approved the continuing resolution in bipartisan votes after congressional leaders reached a broader agreement on spending levels through September 2024. The stopgap measure buys lawmakers additional time to finalize the \$1.59 trillion appropriations legislation and clear both chambers.

The continuing resolution finances federal operations at current levels through March 1 for most agencies and March 8 for others, including DoD. This marks the third short-term extension since September.

The latest continuing resolution staves off imminent funding disruption while negotiations proceed on the broader spending package. Lawmakers will utilize the coming weeks to translate the agreed <u>budget framework</u> into detailed appropriations language needed to keep the government running past March.

Congress must reach a funding deal by April 30 to avoid an automatic 1% across-the-board budget cut, as required by the Fiscal Responsibility Act passed in June 2023. MOAA urges all members to contact their lawmakers immediately and demand they finalize full-year appropriations to avert further disruption.

<u>Write your lawmakers today to make your voice</u> <u>heard</u> – Congress needs to pass the funding bills our community relies upon.
