He provided updates on the latest legislative accomplishments, a synopsis of how the medical centers operated during Hurricane Ian, and as a response to an inquiry, provided information on items we can donate to support the vets that use the medical centers for their care. We are still coordinating with Mr. Dunning and will provide more information at a later date.

Our November Program

Our guest speaker for November is Mr. George Mayer. Mr. Mayer will discuss the *SS American Victory*, a WWII supply ship and now floating museum in Tampa Bay.



The SS American Victory is a Victory ship that saw brief service in the Pacific Theater of Operations during the final months of World War II, the Korean War from 1951–1954, and the Vietnam War from 1966–1969. Built in June 1945, she carried ammunition and other cargo from Los Angeles to Southeast Asia, then ferried cargo, equipment, and troops back to the US.

Today, the ship is one of only four operational World War II merchant steamships in the US. The SS American Victory provides daily educational tours, serves as a training site for fire-



fighters, law enforcement officers, and active and reserve military and working dogs, hosts special events, and benefits from memberships, donations, and corporate sponsorships.

Since the SS American Victory arrived in Tampa in September 1999, dedicated volunteers have invested over 1,000,000 hours to restore, maintain and operate the vessel. The American Victory Ship and Museum is a nonprofit 501c3 organization recognized in the National Register of Historic Places. The ship is located directly behind The Florida Aquarium in the Water Street District of Tampa.

Mr. Mayer served in the US Navy as a corpsman on the USS Forrestal and at US Naval Air Station, Key West. He holds a Master's Degree from the University of South Florida in American History and taught for 47 years at Gulf High school. He is married with two children and three grandchildren.

Our Annual Meeting will occur on 2 November 2022. Our Bylaws (Article VII, Section 2) state, "There shall be an annual meeting of the Chapter during November for the receipt of annual reports, the determination of annual dues for the next calendar year, the election of officers and directors, and the transaction of other business. Notice of the annual meeting shall be published no later than the Chapter's October newsletter."

Article XII, Section 1 further states, "These bylaws may be amended, repealed, or altered in whole or in part by a two-thirds vote of those members present at any duly constituted meeting of the Chapter. A copy of any amendment proposed for consideration must be published in the Chapter's newsletter prior to the meeting."

A Bylaws Committee has been hard at work since last Spring to update the Chapter bylaws, they were posted in the October newsletter, and a motion will be made at this annual meeting to adopt the new bylaws. Most of the changes were to provide updated and more understandable language, remove duplicate or conflicting items, and correct inappropriate punctuation.

Sun City Center Veterans Day Ceremony

On Friday, November 11th, as a public tribute to all military veterans, Sun City Center will observe Veterans Day at the SCC Community Association's Community Hall located at 1910 South Pebble Beach Boulevard. The combined Sun City Center military veterans organizations are sponsoring the ceremony to recognize our many community veterans; however, American Legion Post 246 is taking the lead in organizing the event.

The program will start at 10:00 a.m., and it is suggested that all guests be seated by 9:45 a.m. Doors will be opened at 9:00 a.m., and coffee and cookies will be provided. Wearing masks is optional. The event is free, and the public is invited.

Our guest speaker will be Mr. Bob Black, United States Army Korean War Veteran. Bob is a dynamic speaker awarded the Combat Infantry Badge as a member of the Second Infantry Division in the Korean "War."

The Grand Marshal will be Mr. Ken Barringer, a World War II veteran who saw duty in the Pacific Theater.

In addition to our guest speaker, the program will include a traditional musical interlude by the Trinity Singers, directed by Rev. Bob Walker, including those military tributes usually rendered to honor our present and deceased veterans.

Immediately following the ceremony, a wreath emplacement will occur at the Veterans Memorial located at the hall's front entrance.

MOAA SCC FL42 member Bob Putnam recruited new member and chapter Legislative liaison Joe Muhlberger. They met at weekly Thursday 7am breakfasts at the Ruskin Bob Evans Restaurant event called "Bob's Vets" where all Veterans are welcomed as participants.



Here's a bit about Bob from his time as a Lieutenant in our US Army during the Vietnam War.

I did my Basic Training and Advanced Infantry Training (AIT) at Ft Dix, NJ and then from there I did six months of training at Officer Candidate School (OCS) at the "Home of the Infantry," Ft Benning, GA. Upon being commissioned as a Second Lieutenant (2LT) I was at Ft Knox with the 54th Infantry which is a mechanized unit. I did Jungle Training in Panama and from there onto Vietnam. Upon arrival in Vietnam, I was assigned to Company C of the 1st Battalion, 27th Infantry Regiment, better known as the "Wolfhounds" which are assigned under the 25th Infantry Division, nicknamed "Tropic Lightning."

My tour of duty included serving as a platoon leader for nine months and then as a liaison officer working with the Military Assistance Command, Vietnam (MACV) and Australian forces. My time as a platoon leader included working with the "Brown Water" Navy along the Vietnam/ Cambodia border. Our unit also took part in the Cambodian invasion. After this I finished my tour and went back to the States where I rejoined my wife and son.


It's been a tough slog so far this year to move our legislators to support the Bills on MOAA's "**Key Advocacy Issues."**

However, there has been some good news

On Wednesday, August 10, 2022 The Sergeant First Class (SFC) Heath Robinson Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxins (PACT) Act ("The PACT Act") was signed into law. To learn more about The PACT Act, the Veterans Administration (VA) provides the following website. https://www.va.gov/resources/the-pact-act-and-your-va-benefits/

- The House passed their version of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA).
- The Richard Star Act gained over 300 co-sponsors in the House. On February 22, 2021 this bill was introduced in the Senate. If passed into law, this bill would allow a veteran with a combat-related disability and fewer than 20 years of creditable service to receive retirement pay, without reduction, concurrent with disability compensation.

On January 4, 2022 MOAA stood up their New Legislative Action Center. And here's something we should be proud of - from a trial run of the data collected by Quorum, MOAA's advocacy software.



Florida is the most engaged State using MOAA's messaging system with 12,016 contacts since February. While MOAA is still working on validating this type of data, the ranking against the color bar below the map definitely differentiates Florida from the rest of the herd.

Right now there are 33 active Legislative Campaigns posted to the Legislative Action Center on the MOAA website. There is plenty of advocacy work to be done - and more messages to be sent. To receive updates as they are released login to your MOAA account, go to MOAA.Quorum.us, and click the "Sign Up" label. Or, simply wait for our next newsletter overview provided by new Chapter Legislative Liaison Joe Muhlberger.





In 2022, this included lobbying for the passage of the PACT Act for those servicemembers impacted by burn pits and other toxic substances. MOAA also successfully pushed for DoD to create an appeal process for Tier 4/non-covered prescription drugs and increased respite care hours for medically complex family members enrolled in TRICARE's Extended Care Health Option (ECHO).

We support annual pay increases for servicemembers to keep up with the increases in the cost of living as well as the DoD's Military Spouse Fellowship pilot program, which will provide additional employment and career growth opportunities for the families of many of our members.




