Dr. Susan A. MacManus is a University of South Florida Distinguished University Professor Emerita (Department of Government and International Affairs, School of Inter-



disciplinary Global Studies). From 1998 to 2015, she was a political analyst for WFLA News Channel 8 (Tampa's NBC affiliate). Since 2016, Dr. MacManus has been the political analyst for ABC Action News (Tampa's ABC affiliate). She is a featured columnist on safiereview.com, a widely read Florida-based political

website, and has appeared on every major broadcast and cable television and radio network. Dr. MacManus is Florida's most-quoted political scientist. She is not affiliated with any political party.

Dr. MacManus has authored or co-authored numerous publications on Florida politics, including *Florida's Minority Trailblazers: The Men and Women Who Changed the Face of Florida Government, Politics in Florida, Young v. Old: Generational Combat in the 21st Century,* and *Targeting Senior Voters.* She and her mother, Elizabeth, also authored two local Florida history books: *Citrus, Sawmills, Critters & Crackers: Early Life in Lutz and Central Pasco County* and *Going, Going, Almost Gone: Lutz-Land O' Lakes Pioneers Share Their Precious Memories.* 

Dr. MacManus received her M.A. from the University of Michigan and Ph.D. from Florida State University. She will offer a not-to-be-missed presentation about local Florida politics on May 1st, 2024.

## **From The President**

# ATTENTION ALL Chapter Members. WE NEED YOUR HELP.

At the beginning of 2024, our Chapter had a total of 170 members. We had a welcome addition of 26 new members during that year. In January 2024, we compiled a list of 85 members that had not paid their 2024 dues. Your Board members have attempted to contact all the members on that list. With very limited success!

Our By Laws indicate the following:

<u>Section 3</u>. Annual dues, while payable anytime, are due 1 January of each year and may be considered delinquent if unpaid by 1 February unless members have made other arrangements to pay their dues. <u>Section 4</u>. Officer and surviving spouse members who do not pay their dues by 1 March shall no longer be considered members in good standing. <u>Section 5</u>. In conjunction with the President, it shall be the responsibility of the Membership Chair to recommend delinquent members for termination to the Board of Directors.

We stand to lose up to 50 members for nonpayment. Please remember, your \$20 dues are used for awards and grants to members of the local community (JROTC scholarships, My Warrior's Place, Southeastern Guide Dogs, and other Grants.)

## Legislative Liaison Corner LTC Jeff Camp, USA (Ret)

Please take a moment to login to the Legislative Quorum. The Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) has outlined several legislative priorities for 2024. These priorities focus on supporting veterans, their families, caregivers, and survivors. Some of the key legislative priorities include:

- 1. **Protection Against 'Claims Sharks'**: MOAA is advocating for the GUARD VA Benefits Act, which aims to impose penalties on those charging veterans' unreasonable fees for assistance with disability claims.
- 2. **Preserving Earned Burial Benefits**: Through the Expanding America's National Cemetery Act, MOAA is working to ensure veterans and their families continue to receive the burial benefits they have been promised.
- 3. **Support for Children of Fallen and Disabled Veterans**: The organization supports the CHAMPVA Children's Care Protection Act, which would extend healthcare coverage under the VA program to children of eligible veterans until age 26.
- 4. **Improvement of Survivors' Benefits**: The Caring for Survivors Act is another focus, aiming to align Dependency and Indemnity Compensation with other federal programs to provide better support to survivors.
- 5. Support for Military Sexual Trauma Survivors: MOAA backs the SAVES Act to enhance access to care and services for military sexual trauma survivors within the Veterans Health Administration.
- 6. Expansion of Services for Aging and Disabled Veterans: Legislation like the Expanding Veterans' Options for Long Term Care Act is being supported to provide more care options for aging veterans.
- 7. **Rights for Surviving Spouses**: The Love Lives On Act is being promoted to eliminate penalties for surviving military spouses who remarry before the age of fifty-five.

Please take a moment to personalize the letters from the quorum, print them out and mail them to your representatives. This is the best way to tell your elected officials how you feel and how you would like them to represent us.


# **Support Your MOAA Charities**

## **Designated Scholarships**

A Designated Scholarship is a scholarship named in memory or honor of a loved one, friend, colleague, organization, or in your own name. The minimum donation for a Designated Scholarship is \$25,000. The student selected to receive the Designated Scholarship receives both a grant and an interest-free loan. As long as the student reapplies for the loan and maintains their academic standing, they will receive the Designated Scholarship for up to five years.

Each donor receives information about his or her Designated Scholar. Each Designated Scholar is required to correspond with and thank their donor at least once a year. A list of all new Designated Scholars and their donors is published annually in the November issue of *Military Officer* magazine.

## Memorial Day: A Time to Remember and Reflect

As the warm breeze of late spring envelops the United States, families gather, flags flutter, and a solemn reverence fills the air. **Memorial Day**, observed on the last Monday of May, holds a special place in the hearts of Americans. Let us delve into the significance of this cherished holiday.

## **Origins and Evolution**

Originally known as **Decoration Day**, Memorial Day emerged in the aftermath of the **Civil War**. The conflict, which concluded in the spring of 1865, exacted a heavy toll—more lives lost than any other war in U.S. history. The nation grappled with grief, and the need arose to honor those who had made the ultimate sacrifice.

Unlike the anniversary of any specific battle, this date was chosen to honor all fallen soldiers. At **Arlington National Cemetery**, General James Garfield delivered a poignant speech, and 5,000 participants adorned the graves of the 20,000 Civil War soldiers interred there.

Northern states embraced this commemorative tradition, and by **1890**, each had declared **Decoration Day** an official state holiday. The solemn act of decorating graves became a sacred rite—a way to express gratitude for the freedom preserved by those who gave their lives.

## A Day of Remembrance

Today, Memorial Day transcends mere tradition. It is a **national holiday** that unites Americans in honoring the brave men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military. Here's why it matters:

**1.Reflection**: Memorial Day prompts us to pause and reflect. We contemplate the cost of freedom—the sacrifices made by countless individuals who answered the call of duty.

2. Unity: Families, communities, and the nation come together. We stand alongside those who lost loved ones, sharing their grief and honoring their resilience.

**3.Tradition**: Visiting cemeteries, placing flags on graves, and participating in parades—these rituals connect us to our past and reinforce our commitment to the future.

Commercial solicitation of members using membership rolls and/or rosters is prohibited. Articles may be taken from MOAA and DoD publications. The Chapter is tax exempt under Section 501(c)(19) of the Internal Revenue Codes.
