President's Message CDR Bill Kirkpatrick, USN (Ret)

So, the holidays are now almost behind us, and it is my hope that every member of our chapter has had a healthy, active, and happy time with friends and family.

On December 14th, many Veteran's organizations participated in the Wreaths across America program at Ruskin Memorial Cemetery. Estimated participation was well over 300 folks, including all the youth organizations. In 2023, we had less than 100 participants, with many of those young people involved with these youth groups.

The purpose of the Wreaths program is to *Remember, Honor and Teach*: Remember our deceased Veterans, Honor our heroes with a wreath placed on their grave and Teach our youth the value of freedom and patriotism.

Our MOAA Motto is <u>"Never stop serving"</u> and there were several of our Sun City Chapter members involved with the Ruskin Wreaths project.



It was the second annual event that our MOAA Chapter member Walt Cawein has organized. Walt has taken an active and personal interest in supporting

and honoring our deceased American heroes. He organized several grave cleaning events last year and spent the two weekends, prior to the 14^{th,} making sure our veteran's stones were ready for the wreaths.

January 2024 Program RADM Lawrence C. Chambers. USN (Ret)

Born in Bedford, VA, Rear Admiral Lawrence C. Chambers '52, USN (Ret.), lost his Navy veteran father at age four and grew up with



his four siblings in Washington, DC, under the nurturing influence of his maternal grandparents. While in high school, Admiral Chambers, taking his cue from fellow Dunbar High School alumnus Wesley Brown, honed his academic and leadership skills, turned down offers from Harvard and MIT, and joined Brown at the Naval Academy—a move that culminated with his becoming the first African American Naval Academy

graduate promoted to flag rank.

After a tour of duty in Columbus, Admiral Chambers reported to flight training and received his wings in 1954. Chambers flew various fixed-wing aircraft, including the AF Guardian, the A-1 Sky Raider, the A-4 Skyhawk, and the A-7B Corsair II. Admiral Chambers' early command tours included Attack Squadron VA-15 and USS White Plains. Under Chambers' leadership, the White Plains earned the Ney Award for Best Small Ship Mess Afloat and the Type Commander's "E." In 1975, Admiral Chambers assumed command of the USS Midway, becoming the first African American to command an aircraft carrier. Under his command, the USS Midway played a critical role in rescuing South Vietnamese Air Force Major Bung Ly (Lee), his wife, and five children.

In December 1977, following a successful tour as skipper of Midway, Admiral Chambers was promoted to rear admiral. Admiral Chambers' later naval career included command of Carrier Strike Groups 3 and 4 and assignment as Vice Commander, Naval Air Systems Command. He retired from active duty in 1984 and began a second career in industry. Working for Unisys Corporation, he managed the Federal Aviation



Administration and international weapons systems programs. Following retirement from Unisys, he embarked on a third career with Kinnevik AB, taking assignments in developing countries worldwide. Recently, he has focused on community service, including supporting the Midway Museum.



News release from December 16, 2024.

House Committee on Veterans' Affairs Media Release: Today, House Committee on Veterans' Affairs Chairman Mike Bost (R-III.), and Rep. Juan Ciscomani (R-Ariz.), released the following statements after the House voted 382-12 to send the bipartisan, bicameral Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act, to the president's desk signed to be into law:

"There is no better way to close out the Congress than to pass a good bill for veterans and their families," said Chairman Bost. "I am so proud of the changes the Dole Act will bring to VA to modernize, improve, and reshape the delivery of care and benefits. We worked hard to craft this legislation to put veterans – not government bureaucracy – at the core of it. The Dole Act will do that by expanding economic opportunities, simplifying the disability claims process, reforming services for aging veterans, opening more doors for mental health support, and a lot more. I want to thank my friend and colleague, Rep. Ciscomani, our colleagues in the Senate, and the dozens of outside organizations and stakeholders for their support and advocacy to help us deliver for veterans. I look forward to seeing President Biden sign this bill into possible." law soon as as

"Our freedoms are built on the courage, dedication, and sacrifice of our veterans. When they hang up their uniform and transition back into civilian life, it is Happy New Year! Good news from DC!! I'm looking our turn to stand for them," said Rep. Ciscomani. "As we close the 118th Congress, I am glad to see both chambers of Congress approved my bill, the Dole Act, which makes great strides to modernize and reform the VA, expand access to job training and employment opportunities, streamline the disability claims process, and improve the delivery of care and benefits, whether at the VA or at home. I am grateful to Chairman Bost, my colleagues in the House and Senate, and all the veterans and veteran-serving organizations that worked on this legislative package, and I urge the President to sign this bill into law as soon as possible."
